

A Governance-First Approach to Excel, Distribution and Audit Readiness.

1. Executive Summary

Excel remains one of the most widely used formats for financial and operational reporting. However, for regulated organizations, Excel introduces material risk when reports are manually formatted, inconsistently labeled, insecurely distributed, or poorly logged.

CRMReposAPI eliminates these risks by enforcing system-level governance over Salesforce report exports—without relying on user behavior or custom code.

CRMReposAPI automatically:

- Applies standardized headers and footers to every page
- Logs every report execution and distribution event
- Optionally encrypts Excel files using Microsoft-native AES-256
- Enforces “least privilege” distribution through recipient-level controls
- Embeds audit evidence directly into the report itself

2. The Compliance Problem with Traditional Excel Reporting

Auditors do not object to Excel as a format—they object to **how Excel is handled**.

- Optional policy-specific language

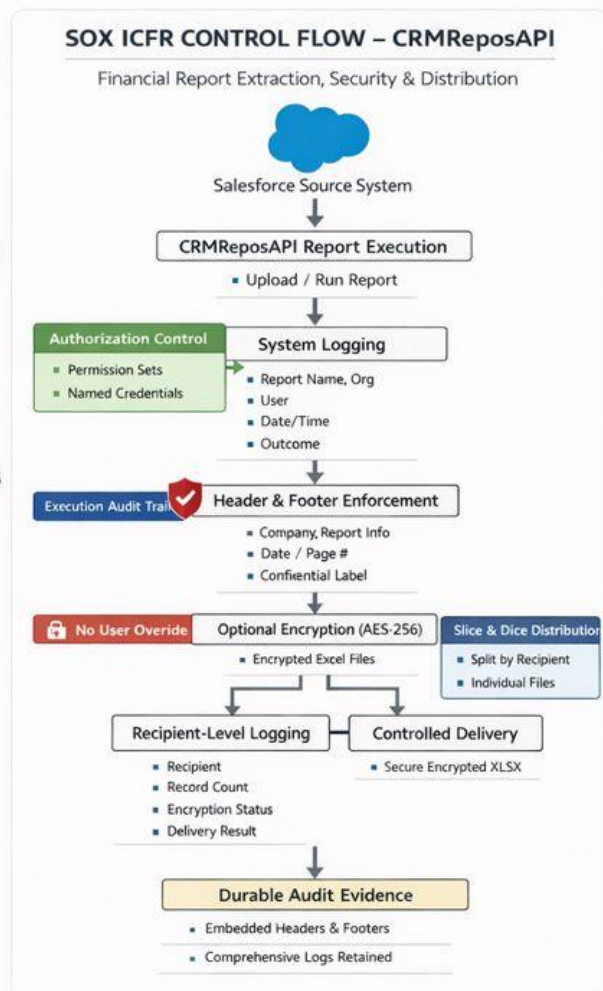
