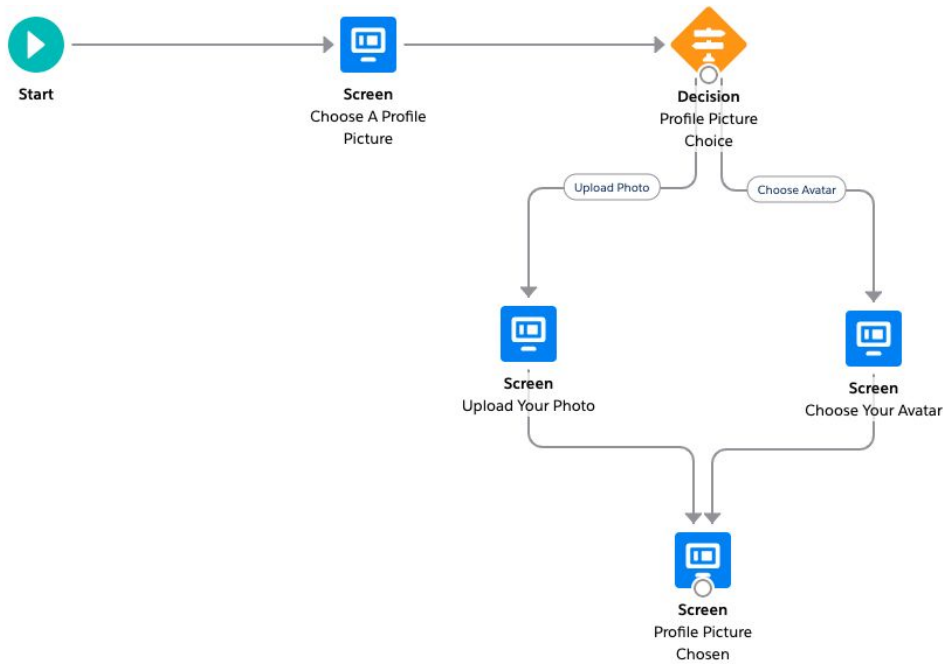
## Setup

The Profile Photo/Avatar Uploader component does not have any particular setup steps required but is essential to have your 'My Domain' set in order to view the Lightning Components available.

You will be able to just install and go with the [Flow templates](#) provided, or you can make some [configuration](#) updates to your liking.

## Flow Templates

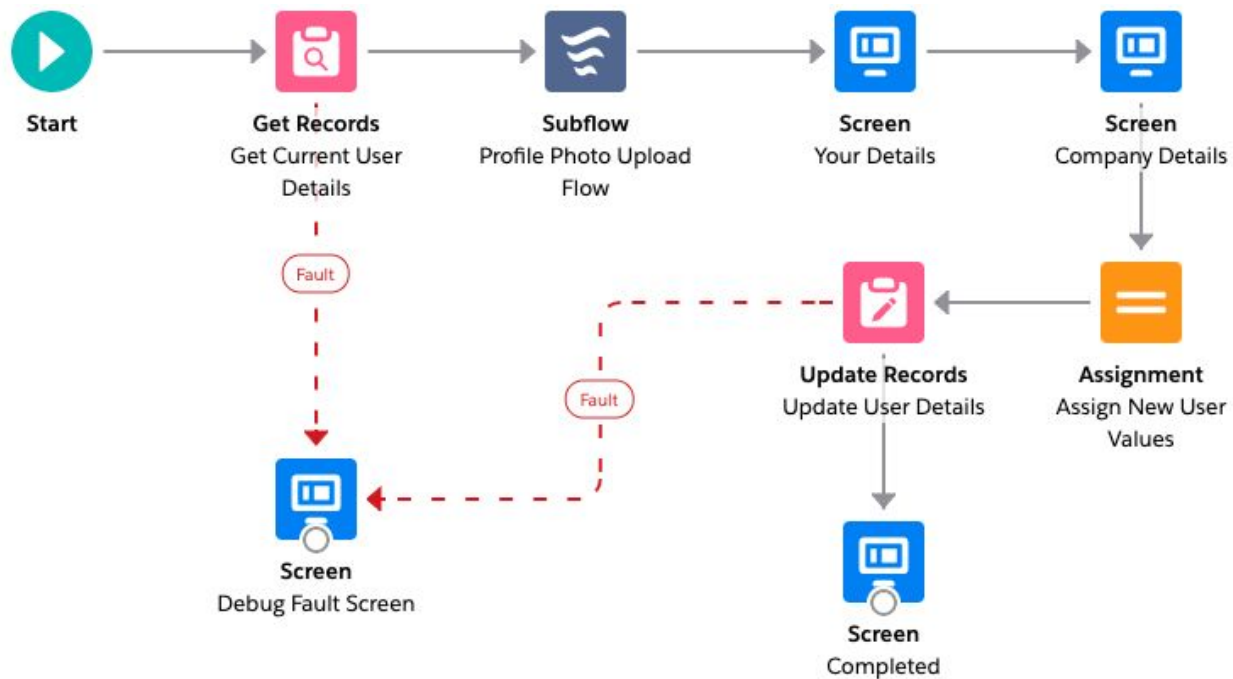
### Photo Uploader



This is the key flow template that comes with the package and makes use of both of the components provided, there will be a [choice screen component](#) and the [uploading component](#).

You may use this as a subflow to quickly reuse this structure anywhere.

## User Profile Update Flow



This is a simple User Profile Update Flow that makes use of the Photo Uploader Flow mentioned above as a subflow. It will initially go through the photo uploading process then follows up with user details and company details.

Recommended to use this as a first time login flow or as a recommended action for users without completed details.

# Configuration

## Avatars Configuration

In order to provide you with easier configuration options for what avatars your users will see; the list of avatars are configured in Custom Metadata Types under the type, 'Avatar Picker Settings'.

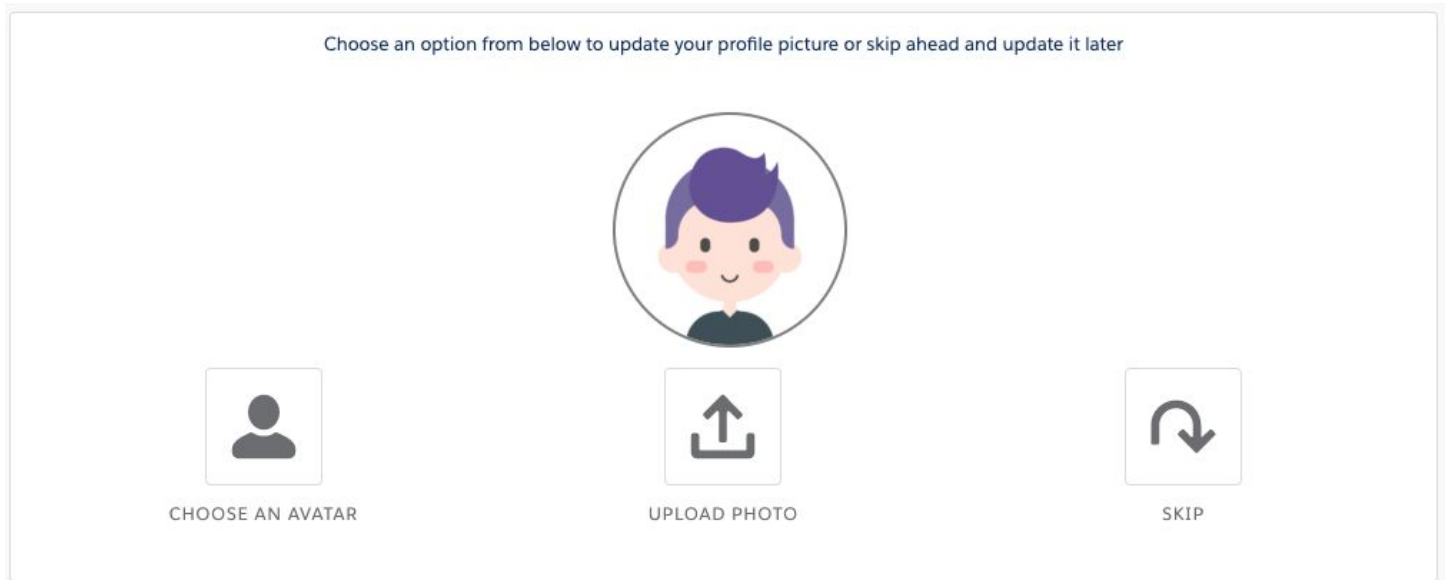

Each record will have the standard Label and Name which are for your own reference only. The key fields for display purposes are:

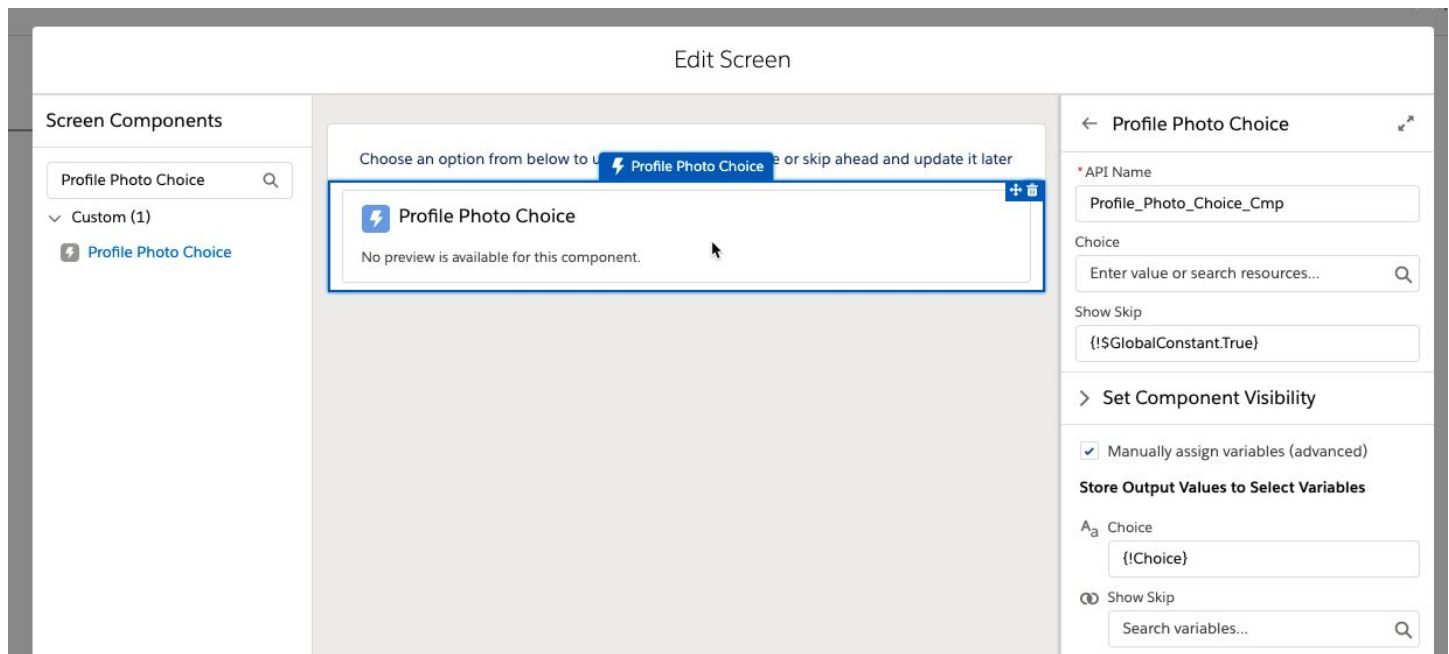
- Static Resource Path - the name of the static resource, it can be a single file or within a zip file also using <staticresourcename> or <staticresourcename>/<filename.filetype>.
- Display Order - the order in which it will be shown within the component. Recommended to go with intervals of 5 or more so if you need to slot something in between it will be easier. E.g. 0, 5, 10, 15.

## Lightning Component Configuration

### Profile Photo Choice



Choice component (figure directly above)



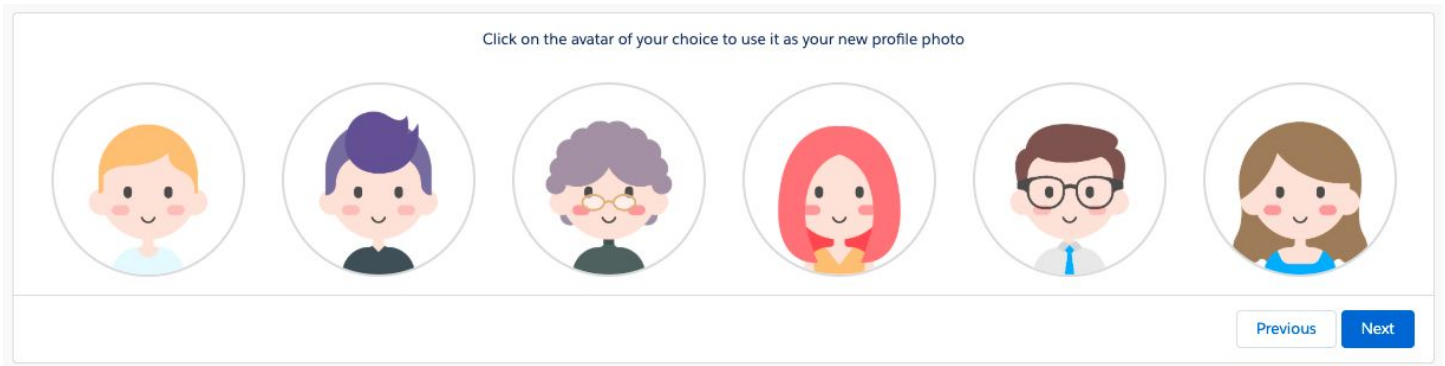
This component is for a clean UI to start off the process of choosing which type of upload the user would like to go with, uploading their own photo, or choosing from a predefined list of avatars.

There are two attributes to take note of:

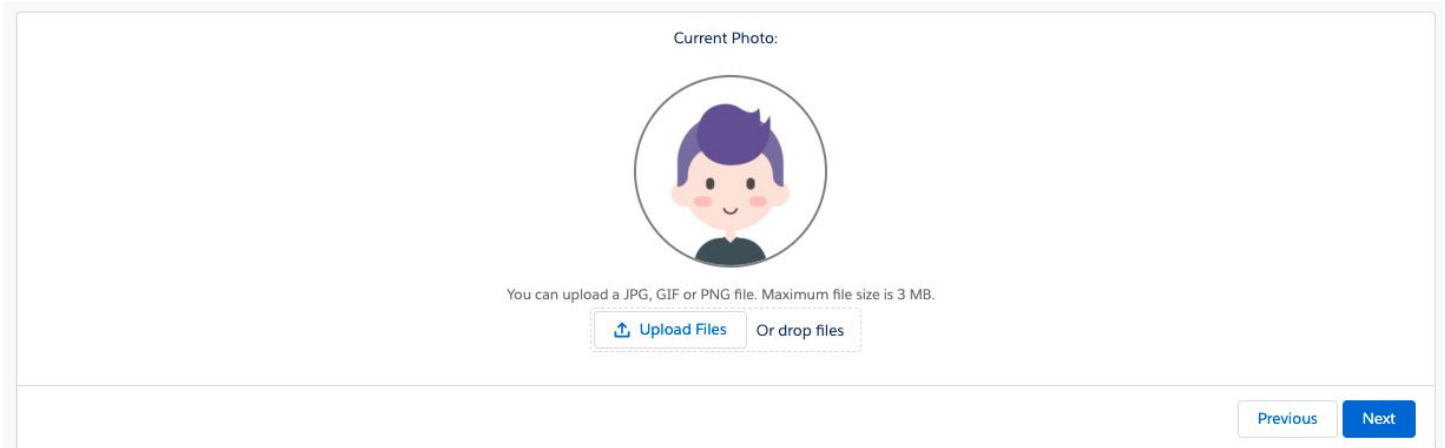
- a. Show Skip (input) - Shows or hide the 'Skip' button, true or false.
- b. Choice (output) - the option selected from this component. The value stored in the variable will either be Avatar, Upload, or null for skip.

[Photo Uploader](#) flow template already has this configured so you may use this as a reference or directly clone it.

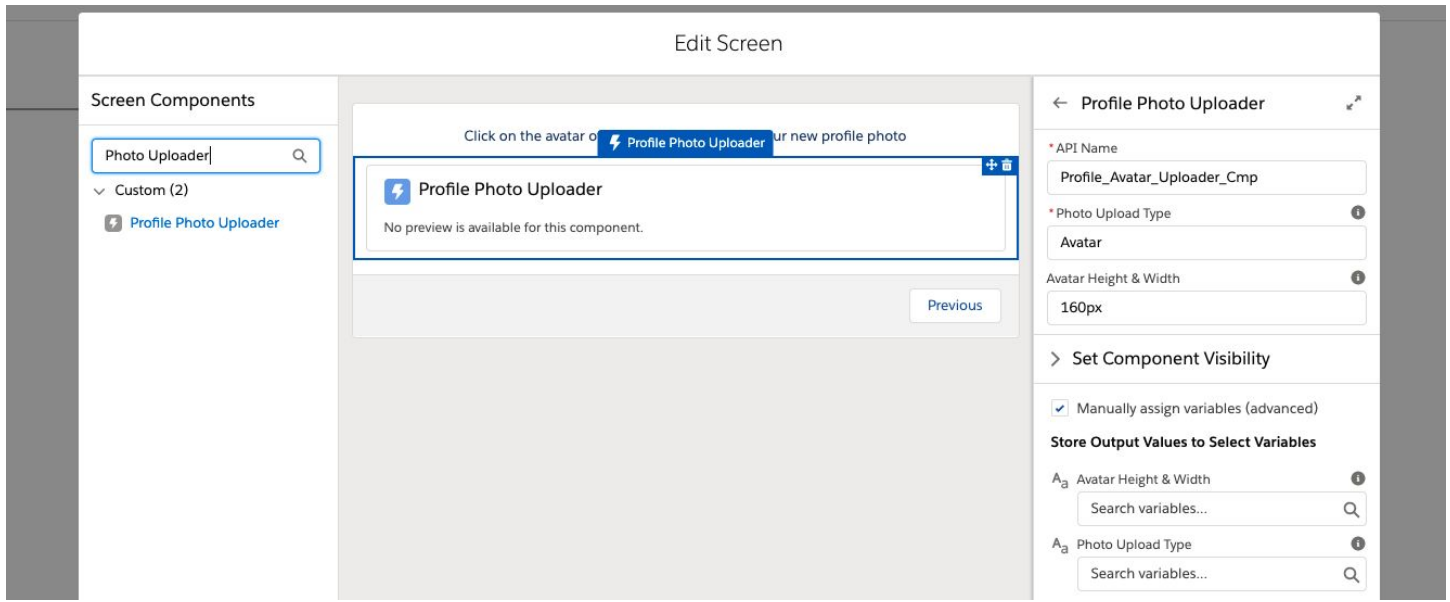
### Profile Photo Uploader

There is little configuration on the component itself as the list of [avatars is configured using a Custom Metadata Type](#) there are two attributes to note here.

- \*Photo Upload Type - this determines which layout is shown by the component. Accepted values are either Photo, or Avatar.
- Avatar Height & Width - used for the Avatar upload type only. This sets the size of the avatars being shown. Accepts most forms of height and width values in CSS.



## Gotchas

- This component was built for use in a Flow only
- If you are unable to see Custom Metadata Types then you are most likely missing the permissions to do so
- Screenshots of the Flow may vary due to certain updates but should still follow a similar format.
