Key Responsibilities

- Ensuring visibility into use and impact of grant funds

Current Challenges

- Overly complex and decentralized systems
- Poor governance and oversight
- Sub-optimal knowledge sharing and visibility
- Excess investment in disparate grants systems

- Inconsistent and incorrect data from agencies
- Inaccurate reporting leads to manual interventions
- Time consuming data collection and validation
- Lack of integration between financial systems and grant systems

- Highly manual tasks lead to inefficiencies
- Lack of collaboration and coordination internally and with sub-recipients
- Inconsistent business processes and workflows
- Inability to collect progress data in a timely manner
