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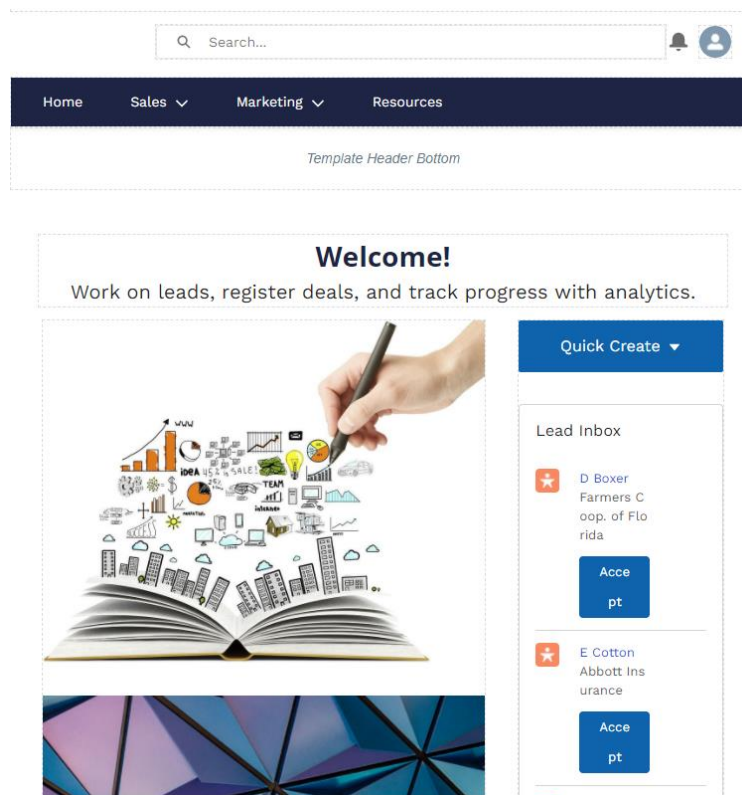
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## 1. Introduction

Image Loader is an application that helps with developing a Salesforce Library Image URL Generator for Digital Experiences that can be used within the Salesforce organization. Images can be directly uploaded from your desktop, and thus refine, design, and improve interaction and performance for your site members.



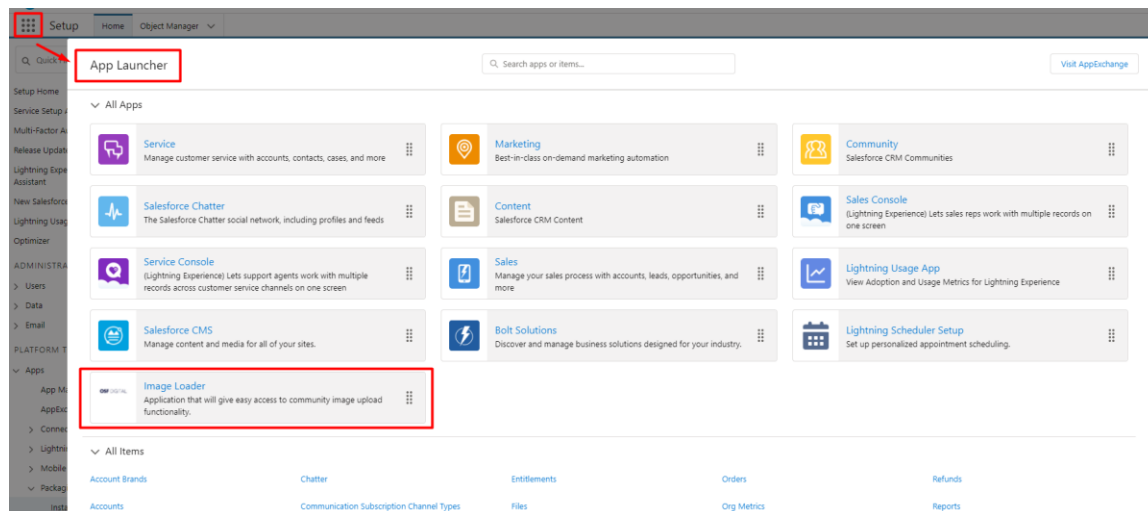
## 2. Business Process Overview

Image Loader generates an URL of an image uploaded from your device and populates the uploaded image within the sites, both for logged-in and guest users.

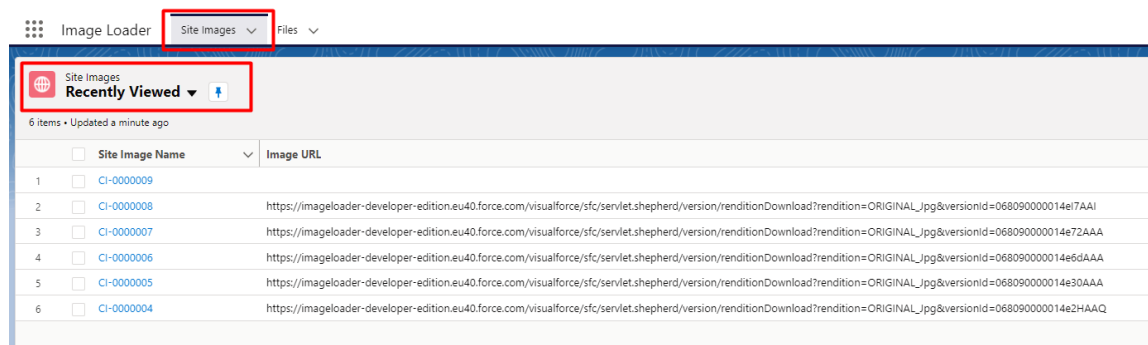
Give all your site members and guest users a secure place to access and see updated information, including images. Improve customer, partner, and employee relationships. Build custom pages and generate image links right away.

### 3. Accessing the Image Loader App

Click the **App Launcher**, and select the Image Loader app.

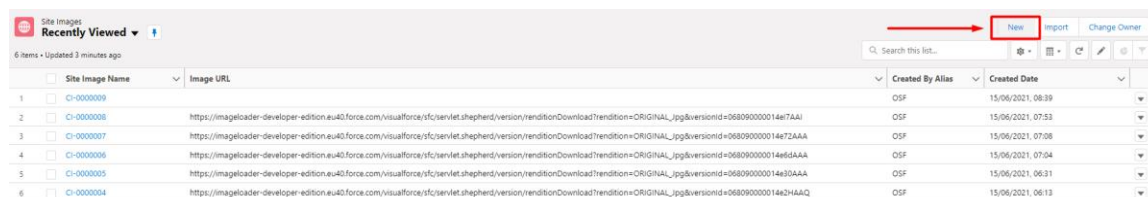


Once Image Loader is selected, you are redirected to the Site Images Object list view.



### 4. Creating a New Site Image Record

To upload a new image and get the image URL automatically generated, per targeted site, go to **Site Images Object**, and click **New**.



A New Site Image module automatically appears with the following three actions available: **Cancel**, **Save & New**, and **Save**.

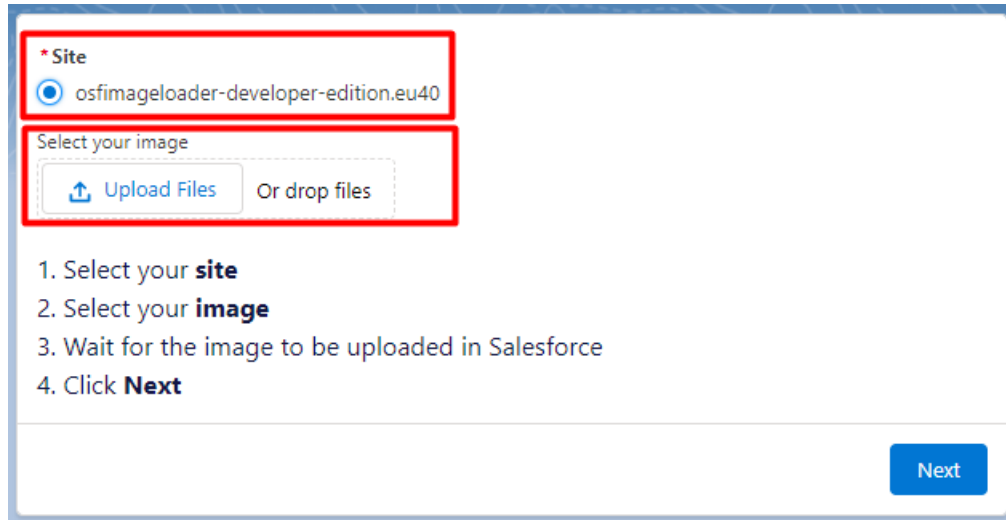
**Note:** The Image URL field is automatically filled in as soon as the image is successfully loaded. To create a new site image record, click **Save** without filling in the Image URL field.

## 5. Uploading an Image

As soon as a new Site Image record is successfully created, you can see a dedicated section to the site and image selection.

To generate a targeted image URL:

1. Select the targeted **Site** where you want to publish your image.
2. Select your image. Click **Upload Files**, and select a desired image from your device, then click **Open**.



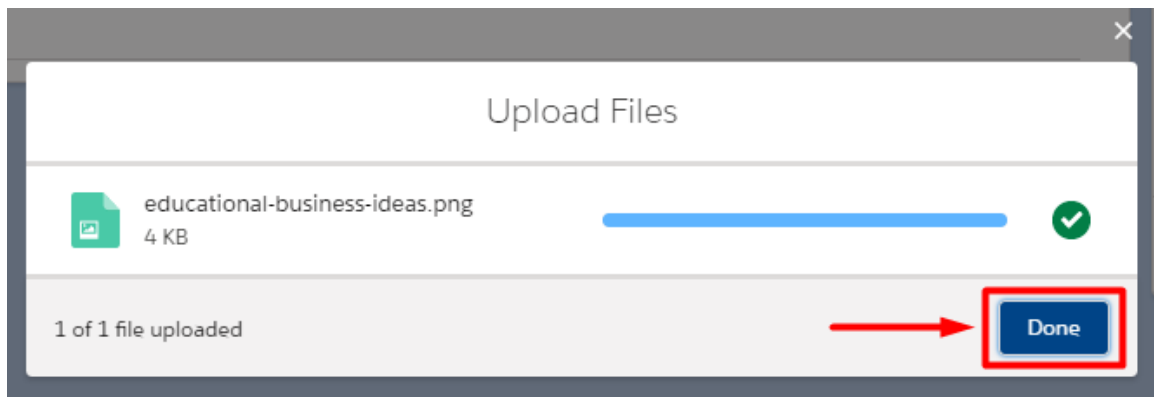

3. Wait for the image to be uploaded in Salesforce
4. Click **Next**

3. Wait for the image to be uploaded to Salesforce, then click **Done**.



4. Click **Next**.

If the image was successfully loaded, the following notification appears:

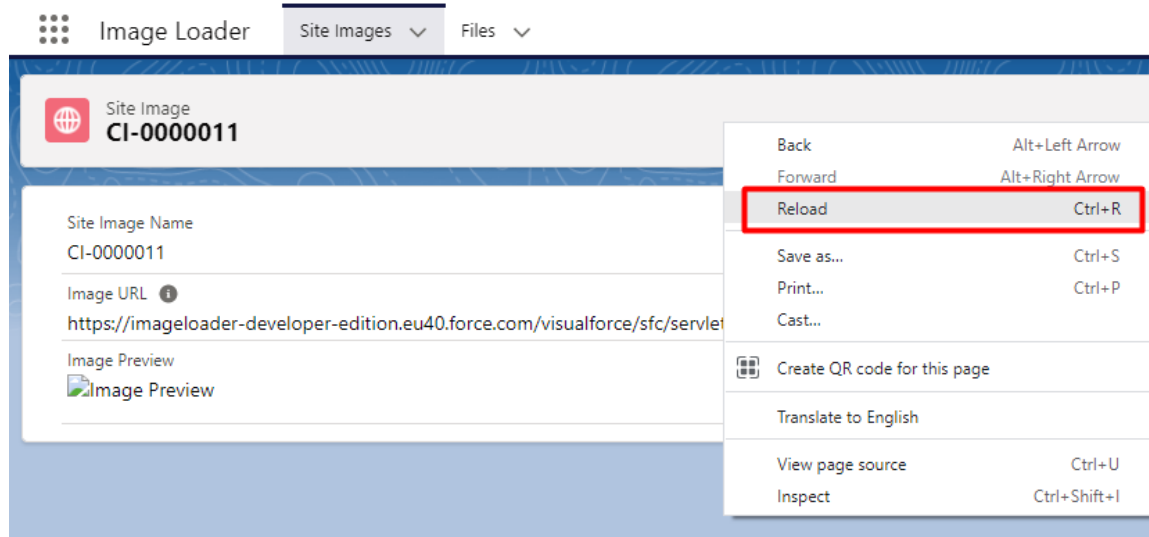
The image was successfully loaded!

Copy the URL found under the **Image URL** field.

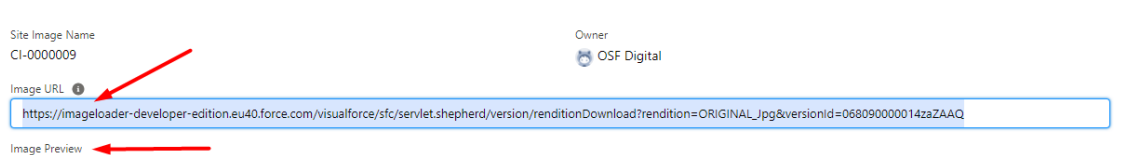
If the image was not loaded, or some of the pre-requisites were incorrectly setup, this notification appears:

5. Right click in the browser/page and select **Reload**.



6. Get the image URL generated and populated in the **Image URL** field, as well as the preview of your loaded image.



## 6. Populating an Image Within a Site

The generated image URL is ready to be pasted into your site, so that both logged-in and guest users can see the shared image.

To populate a targeted image:

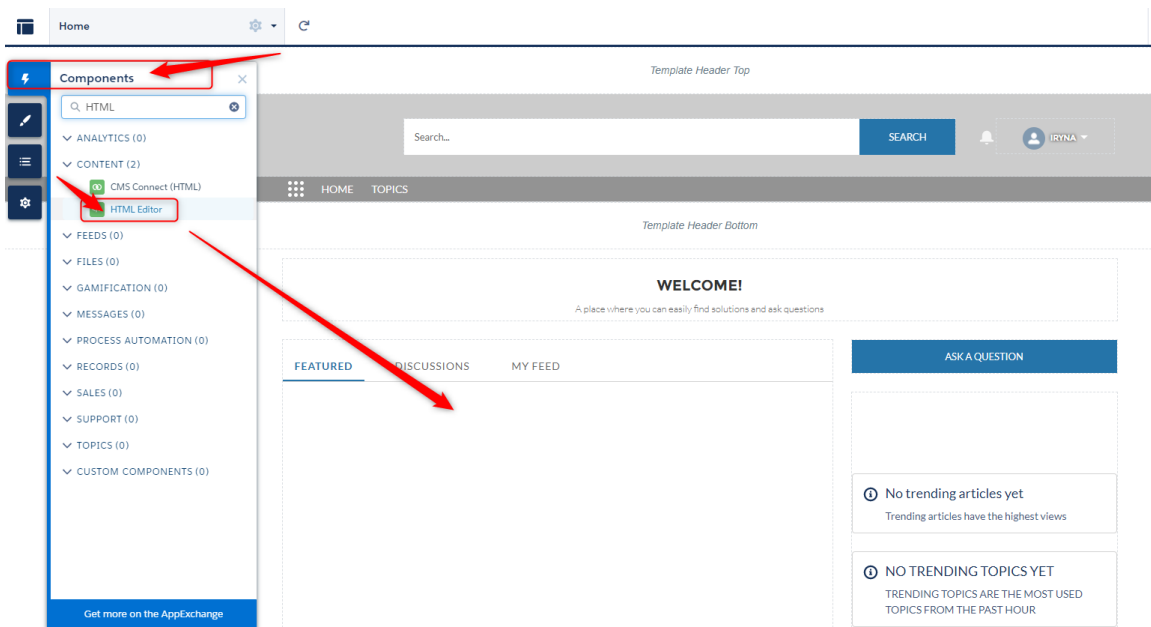
1. Copy the generated **Image URL**.
2. Go to **Setup**, look for All Sites, select the desired Site where the image will be inserted, and click **Builder** next to the Site.

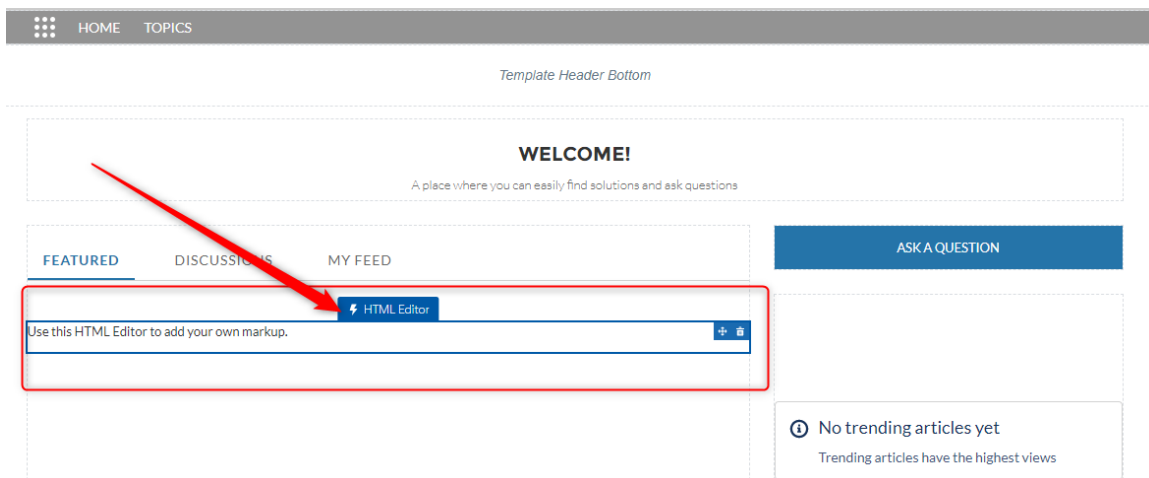

- Go to **Components**, look for the **HTML Editor Component**, and drag & drop the component to the targeted page/section etc.



- Click the **HTML Editor** to add your markup.



5. Copy the previously generated Image URL and paste it within the HTML elements: `<img src='GeneratedImageURL'>`

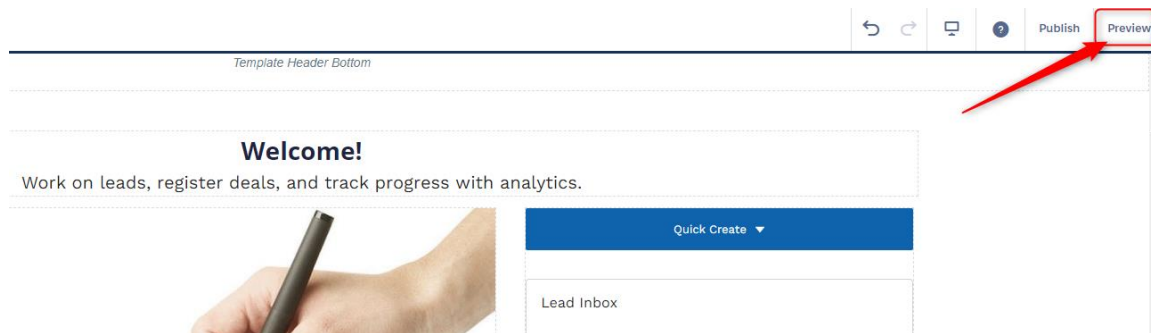

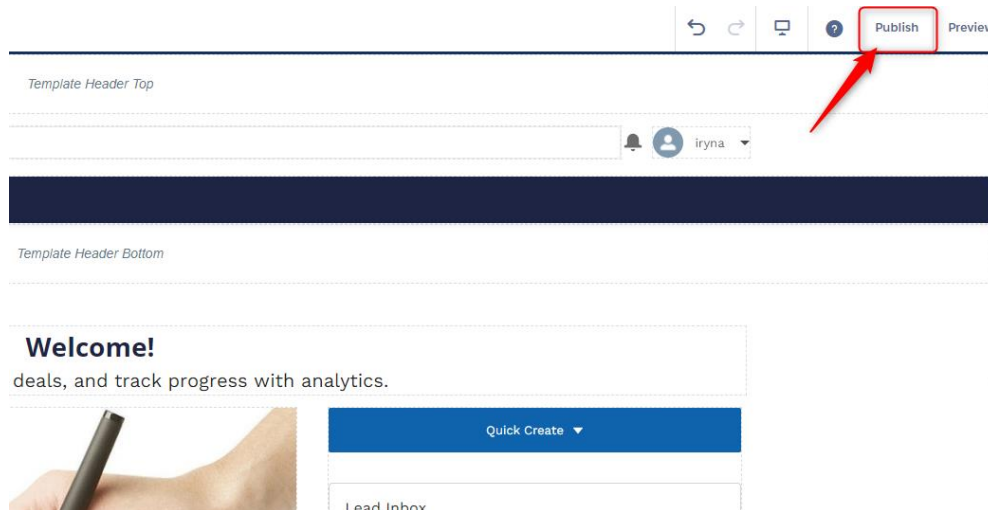

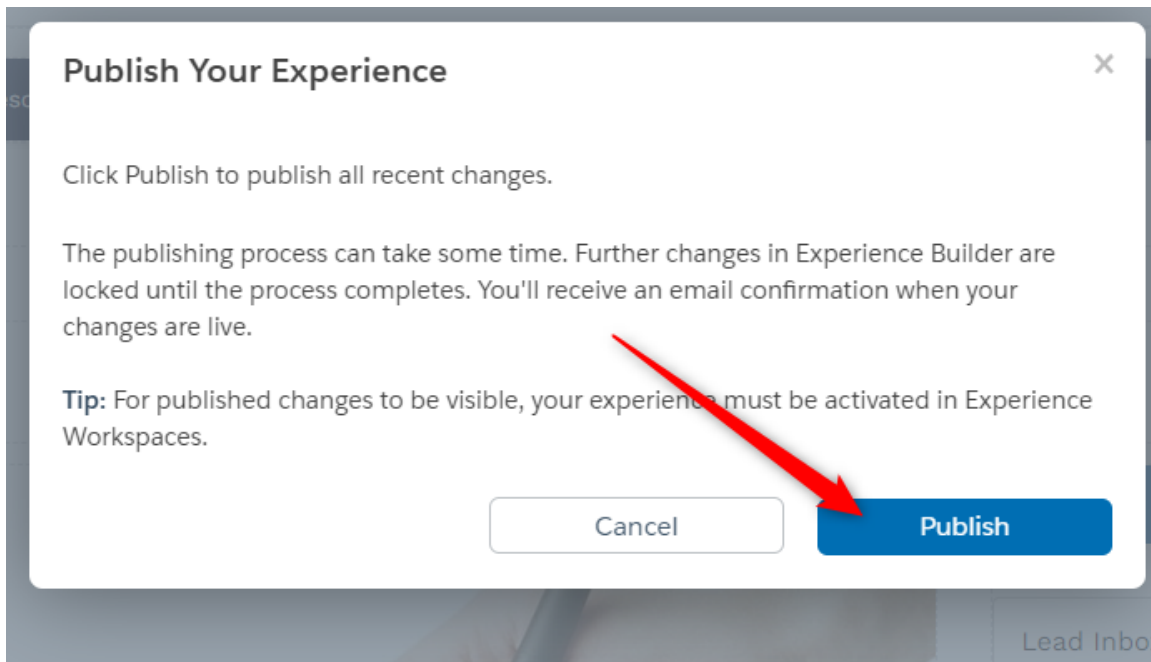
6. Click **Save**. To preview the image, go to the **Preview** mode.



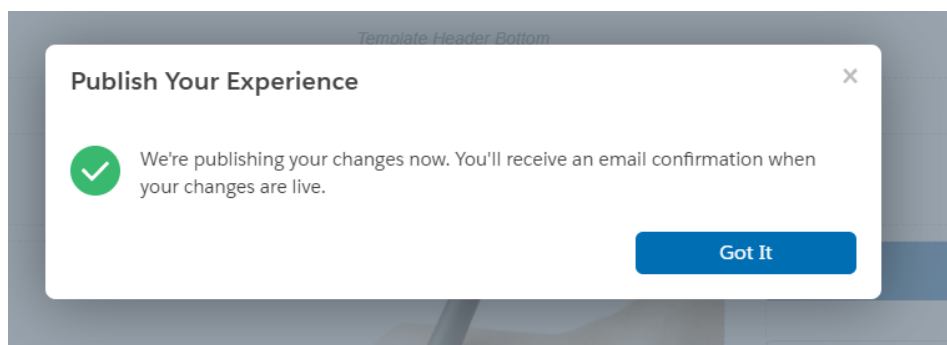
7. Click **Publish**.



8. To confirm the publishing of your recent changes click **Publish**.

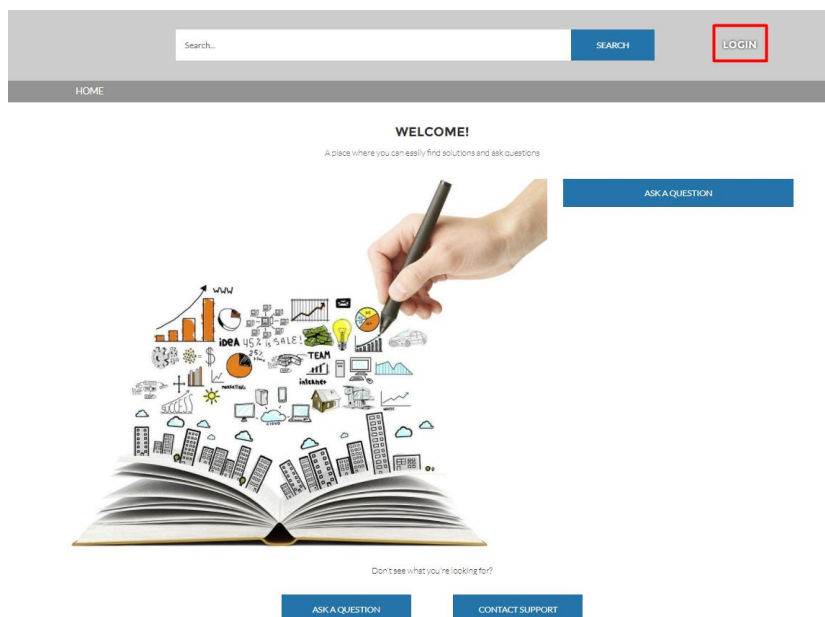


A pop-up notifies you that your changes are in the process of publishing.



Once the publishing is completed, you'll receive an email notifying you that your site's most recent changes were published successfully and are now live on the targeted domain(s).

You can now share the published image with both logged-in members and the guest users of your site by simply sharing the site link (domain) with the targeted audience.
